Nope. That clearly wasn't a deer. While operating the gun was important, being able to know a deer from a horse seems quite basic.



Ministry of Property by Dana Watkins

The Ministry of Property had a very productive 2022 with many projects completed, progressing or in planning. During the Winter, the third-floor hallway was painted in preparation to recarpet. There was a substantial number of leftover carpet pieces from prior installations. By using these pieces, we only had to order a small number of extras to complete the job.

This Spring, we worked with Curt Neill and VBS to obtain and build a Conestoga wagon for their "Going West" theme. After a successful VBS, our attention was to repair and paint the entrance portico off the parking lot. This was an arduous undertaking which took many hours of our member's personal time. Due to vacation and health issues of some members, this project will most likely be completed next Spring.

As most know, a substantial amount of effort and time this year has been devoted to assessing our air conditioners. The large unit which cools both the Fellowship Hall and the Sanctuary is twenty-five years old. Fortunately, it survived another year. The unit which

cools the third floor should be replaced. It has been leaking refrigerant for a few years. The refrigerant used in both units is obsolete and thus very expensive. To change these units, the lines which transport the cool air from the condensers to the air handlers in the attic must be replaced along with the air handlers. These are not easy fixes. The location of these units adds to the replacement expense. Setting a scope of work for bidding and obtaining qualified contractors is very time consuming, however, we must do our due diligence. As always, the coming year will be challenging to us



and the congregation. Prior to a work day, our ministry meets for breakfast to plan, pray and enjoy fellowship. If you are able to serve God thru this ministry for a few hours, a day or as a regular ministry member, please notify the office.

QUILTERS (A Zion Small Ministry) by Betty Jane Szydlowski



The Zion Quilt Ministry is a global outreach ministry. We make quilts and school kit backpacks for Lutheran World Relief (LWR) which are distributed internationally. Those in need may be escaping conflict, natural disasters or extreme poverty.

The quilts are used for warmth, as privacy walls, beds, to carry young children or what few possessions they

may have, and other purposes. The school kits go to children and occasionally an adult so that they can attend school. In many parts of the world, students cannot attend school unless they provide their own supplies.

Our fabric, used linens and blankets, school supplies and monetary funds are provided by the generosity of the congregation. We are most grateful and could not continue without it.

We use all of the fabric we receive. Fabric that has religious, national symbols or camouflage can't be used for international distribution. Quilts made with this fabric go to the NALC Disaster Relief whose scope of operation is national.

Each year our goal is to make 100 quilts and 100 backpacks. This year we made 92 quilts for LWR, 16 quilts for NALC and 104 backpacks filled with the required supplies.

We meet every Thursday from 10 AM – 3 PM. Members come as they are able to cut squares, put the layers of the quilt together or tie the quilts. Usually, two members do the sewing of the quilts and backpacks. Others serve the ministry by sewing the quilt tops at home from the squares and instructions we provide. Whatever your skill level, if you can use a pair of scissors, tie a knot, or pin pieces of fabric together, we welcome you to the ministry. Please join us one Thursday a month or every Thursday or sew from home. It's a wonderful way to be a good Samaritan. A true blessing is the fellowship we have as we laugh, joke, tell stories and care for one another as we work.

On Monday, October 24, 2022, Andrea Zonneveld, the Community Education and Event Coordinator for the Epilepsy Association of Western and Central PA, provided Zion members with an excellent presentation on Epilepsy. The presentation included

information on how to recognize a seizure, how to help someone who is having a seizure and resources available for persons impacted by seizures, as well as opportunities to support the Epilepsy Association. For information see: www.eawcp.org




