

Weekend Experience Team, Strategic Planning

It has been a great year with more people attending services in-person and more inperson opportunities. As part of the five-year strategic plan implemented by the Council of Elders in 2021, a team was formed to focus on improving the visitors' and members' experience from the moment they enter Zion through to exiting the parking lot. Our goal is to glorify God and share the love of Jesus in everything we do.

During 2022, we put thought and effort into the experience by working with the staff and ministries at Zion. We created welcoming areas in the Narthex and lower entrance near the stairs. When you enter the Narthex, there are items on the "about us" table on the right, such as pamphlets about Zion's ministries, information about Zion being a NALC congregation, and various other items that may help members and visitors discern how they may plug in and help glorify God through worship, ministry work and fellowship. Thank you to the ministry leaders who provided the great input for these brochures. The other "want to learn more" table on the left has items geared to members and items to help with hearing or seeing during worship. Coming soon to both welcoming areas will be a Ministry Needs Cross so that we can bear a little bit of the cross that Zion's ministries carry and provide a small amount of help through giving items, time, or donations. The concept will be similar to the Angel Tree during Advent and the Giving Cactus used to obtain donations for VBS.

Weekend Experience helped with the purchase of Zion's new keyboard to improve the worship experience by having a variety of music styles. We provided name tags for church leaders and ushers to help visitors feel more comfortable asking questions. Soon you will see English Standard Version (ESV) Bibles in the pews. The service readings and lessons will match the wording in the ESV Bible which is used by NALC.

Those who graciously donated the current pew Bibles will have an opportunity to receive one for their home. Most recently, the Weekend Experience team partnered with the Ministry of Property to purchase new carpeting for the lower entrance and elevator. We hope to have it installed during the first quarter of 2023. Again, a huge thanks to all who's donations and time helped in the above projects!
