A Message from Pastor Mathew

Eileen panicked and began to worry. She dropped to her knees and began to pray, "Lord God, please rescue and restore my grandson back to me!" Soon after this, another large wave rolls in and deposits Josh on the beach, safe and sound. Eileen looks up to heaven and mutters, "and where is that expensive hat I bought him?"

I suppose that's one way to look at the story. Another way would be to give thanks for the gift of life and health. Josh's hat, regardless of how it looked or what it cost, is nothing compared to Josh having been redeemed to his grandmother from the vast salty ocean tomb.

Psalm 106 opens with these words, "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good." God is good. These words speak the truth. But behind these words, they speak another truth. Sure, God is good. But in comparison, looking at our sinful nature, we are not. We can easily be deceived and lose our focus on the Lord. We can easily place our eyes on that which we lack, rather than on the majesty and might of our creator and His gracious faithfulness to us.

To admit that God is good is a challenge because with it we must also put ourselves in the right place. To concern ourselves with a hat over the life of our own flesh and blood seems extreme, right? Yet, every day we concern ourselves with much more over our own creator. But thanks be to God that His love meets us here and that rather than letting us wash out to sea, his plan of redemption through Jesus begins as his journey to the cross threatens the waves that aim to take us down to the depths.

Zion's BMF Committee has worked over the past several months to meet with all the organizations that receive our donations. These organizations include the following recipients: South Park Meals on Wheels (MOW), Bethel Park MOW, Castle Shannon MOW, Brookline MOW, Pleasant Hills Police Department, Baldwin Police Department, Brentwood School District, Baldwin-Whitehall School District and the Community Clothing Exchange.

We still have a few more organizations for distribution, but they will occur next month. In all cases, our committee sends our members to meet with the organization, rather than just mailing them a check, so as to develop a relationship between Zion and the key members of each recipient organization.
