He starts it up and Fred says, "what's that noise?"

Have you ever discovered something about a gadget you own that you didn't know it could do? This happens with me and technology more often than I feel it should. But I'm learning something new all the time. You certainly want to get the best out of something you have and that's really what I wanted to get into in this month's article.

I'm not talking about a particular gadget, though. Unless you consider your pastor a gadget, that is. Did you know that if you are in the hospital and you'd like me to visit that you can call the church and I'll stop by to see you? Did you know that if you or someone in your home has had a life and death emergency that you can contact me at any hour of the day and, barring some significant limitation, I'll be there? Did you know that if you wanted to just lay something at my feet to pray about or simply talk about that you can schedule a time to meet with me either in your home, my office, or elsewhere? More than all of this, I do it all for free.

Please don't think I'm trying to make a mockery of my work here because I genuinely wonder if everyone knows what it is their pastor is here to do. I can't tell you the number of times I've heard about someone being in the hospital days or even weeks after they've come home, or how someone could've really used some counseling before a big decision and I find out only after that big moment has come and gone, or that a loved one has died and the funeral was last week.



The Council of Elders is refreshing the communication lines between it and the congregation. The monthly meeting minutes are now available in draft form about one week after the COE meeting. These draft minutes are emailed to ministry chairs and are available to members of the congregation by contacting the church office. Meeting minutes will be officially approved at the next COE meeting and will then be available in with the other monthly reports. If any member has any questions or concerns, please speak to me or any other member of the COE.

Our Treasurer, John Thatcher, the office staff, and I have been hard at work refreshing our understanding of the financial software implemented by the previous COE in mid-2023. We have a wonderful resource in a CPA/bookkeeper who is familiar with online QuickBooks and she has been training John and the office staff how to best use the software. Because of the changes made in transitioning to QuickBooks from 360Ledger, the treasurer reports are being refreshed and will look different from the past, but all the financial information will be included. Our hope is that by the time of this newsletter, our Treasurer's first report will be available.

The Ministry of Property has refreshed the entrance alcove off the parking lot. It is now a comfortable and welcoming space with two overstuffed chairs and a small table which will hold our Zion information brochures, which are in the process of being revised and refreshed. The ministry has also refreshed the main hallway of the third floor, removing the clutter, and making it more open and cleaner.

These are all practical things. Pastor Mathew is refreshing Zion's spirits through his teachings and insights on God's Word. Together, we continue to pray for God's direction and refreshed hearts for Zion.

Discipleship by Ministry of Disciple Life

What is a disciple?

A disciple is a follower of Jesus who is being changed by Jesus and is committed to joining Jesus on His mission.

What does a disciple do?

The purpose of being a disciple is daily living and sharing the love of Jesus and showing others how to do the same.

What is a Culture of Discipleship?

We focus on positive words and actions that build others up and encourage deepening relationship with others in Christ and serving Him. We trust in the love and grace of Jesus when we fail and extend that love and grace to others.

Taking the Next Step

Earlier in the Easter season we heard Jesus talk to us about the vine and the branches. Part of this lesson was to teach us that to be his disciples is to abide in him like a branch abides in the vine. It's pretty simple. But, in order for the branch to continue producing fruit the branch needs continual pruning. We learned how that pruning is done by our deepening connection with Christ and the Church. Letting those branches go wild without pruning can actually inhibit fruit-bearing.

Part of the culture of discipleship we are living and creating here at Zion involves fostering an environment of next steps and encouraging everyone to take next steps. Zion is not going to be full of wild branches but branches that are continually pruned so as to produce more and more fruit. What this means is that we want everyone to always be looking at a new step they can take in deepening their faith journey through their connection with Christ and the Church. Maybe that next step is stepping up to serve in a new way or more often. Maybe it means joining a Bible study or small group.

Maybe it means going from attending a Bible study to co-leading one of the sessions. Maybe it means simply taking part in fellowship opportunities and getting to know other disciples. There are always opportunities to expand our reach and gain more exposure in our learning and in our serving as we deepen those connections with Christ and His Church. Let's help you take that next step today.


