

What are the most important things you want people to know? What are the stories you could share about your life? I'm sure we've told them a number of times. When you think about these important parts of your life, the stories, the memories, if you were to write your one line, would it talk about Jesus? Of the many things we could say, would Jesus be there? Would you tell of how he saved you? How he loved you?

The way we live our lives should reflect how John wrote, that while there is much to share, we should take that time to share the most important information about Jesus. If we do that already, then that's great. If we do but not as much, it's time to make some improvements.

I pray that at the end of your day, at the end of your week, at the end of this month, this year, your life... I pray that at the end of all of these you might be able to say, "Jesus did many other things as well. 
The CHOSEN




July 10 - August 28, 7:00 - 8:30 pm.

We're Looking for a Few Good Men!

In the 1980s, the Marines used "We're Looking for a Few Good Men" as a recruiting slogan. While we are looking for a few good men and women, there is a shortage of men to serve with the Homebound Ministry.

According to a fairly recent article in the Wall Street Journal (Barbara Abbott, 11/10/23) "Recent research shows that loneliness and social isolation were linked to an increased risk of death from any cause." The study, published in the BMC Medicine Journal tracked people for a decade before the pandemic and concluded that "loneliness can be bad for health, contributing to health problems including anxiety, heart disease, and depression." Surgeon General, Dr. Vivek Murthy, reporting last May on loneliness and social isolation stated, "that a lacking of social interaction could be as dangerous as smoking 15 cigarettes a day." The uncomfortable distressful feeling of being lonely, overtime, has a negative effect. As Zion's VIsitation Pastor (VIP), I am the keeper of the visitation list, the roster of members, who for some reason or other, cannot attend worship on a regular basis. Our mission is to bring church to them, with Bible reading, prayer, and Holy Communion. This is at least on a monthly basis, with advanced scheduling. My visits have brought me many blessings, but one thing for certain: Many of the homebound are LONELY, even if they won't confess this. Therefore, we are looking for a few good men and women. No, you won't need to run an obstacle course, shine your boots or brass or stand at attention. We are looking for "Adopters," people who can commit to making contact, at least monthly with a person on the visitation list. This can be in a variety of ways: phone calls, texts, notes, letters, emails, or even face-to-face visits, as mutually agreeable and convenient. No special skills are required – just the four C's: Christ-like, Conversation, Concern, and Compassion (read Matthew 25:35-46).
