A Message from Pastor Mathew

"But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." - Luke 2:19

Do you remember that part in the Christmas story where the shepherds go crazy and start telling everyone what just happened? Do you remember what Mary was doing during all of this? The Bible says she treasured up all these things that had happened and pondered them in her heart.

I can't say I know the pain of childbirth nor do I want to risk getting myself into trouble by referring to it much but it sure was possible that Mary... was exhausted. Still, I don't think that is the reason she is silent in this nativity scene. I wonder if Mary's silence is a lesson for us in the experience of the Advent and birth of Christ. What might happen if we didn't quickly go tell it on the mountain? What if instead of celebrating on the hilltops we were to treasure all these things and ponder them in our hearts? What if, this Advent and Christmas season, it was not about the words from our mouths but rather the meditations within our hearts?

Could we do this? Should we do this? I can't make you experience Christmas in one particular way. All I can do is show you that the shepherds went around sharing the good news of Jesus' birth but Mary, in Luke 2, didn't. We put a great emphasis in what the shepherds did and we equate it with our Christian mission to tell others about Jesus, but does this make Mary's actions any less Christian? We must remember that Jesus came for us too. Perhaps in our desire that others experience the joy of Christmas this year we might set aside time for ourselves to experience it too. Just as we have a very personal moment with Jesus in Holy Communion, where His body and blood are given and shed "for you" in that moment and not the person to your right or left, maybe we should allow Christmas to be for us as well. Maybe you should give an opportunity for Jesus to be born "for you." You've likely heard that a chain is only as strong as its weakest link. What happens if you are that weak link? You could be ambitious in sharing Jesus with others but if you haven't taken time to strengthen yourself, what good is the message that you bring?

That all said, I offer to you the response that Mary had to the birth of Jesus. Meditation. Take time to experience Christmas for yourself, pray, read the scriptures, read through devotions, allow your faith to be strengthened as you treasure these things and ponder them in your hearts.

God's blessings to you this Advent and Christmas seasons.


Just what was it that led the Magi to the infant Jesus?
