



A Message from Pastor Mathew

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you" - Ephesians 1:18a

We are entering yet another new year and while any time is a great time to begin new habits, hobbies, or lifestyles, we typically enjoy attempting such feats at key beginnings like a new year. I like to ask people the following question: On a scale of 1-10 where are you in regard to actively deepening your faith? Most people would take this question to mean "where is your faith right now?" but that's not what I'm asking. While your faith may be at a 5 or 6, the question I am asking is how much of an effort are you making at turning that 5 or 6 into a 7 or 8? As we embark on this new year together, I pray that you would consider new ways to actively deepen your faith and to live 2026 for Jesus. Here's two options I'd like to share with you.

1). Participate in or start a new Bible Study

Some of you already participate in Bible studies or small groups, but others don't. Just because you are in a Bible study already doesn't mean that you can't do another one. Go to a second Bible study. If you don't go to a Bible study already, start going to one. There are plenty of options, all of which are different. There are plenty of ways for you to participate in a new Bible study.

2). Pick One Person

There are many thoughts out there on how to best bring Jesus to other people who don't go to church. The NALC focuses on what they call Life to Life Discipleship. Rather than focus on the masses, they encourage people in their congregations to single people out and develop a relationship with them. Many people already have friendships or family relationships with those who don't go to church and this is a great way to start. Engage within one of those relationships and do what you can to share your faith with them. Do you have a book that you enjoyed reading about faith? Pass it on to them. Do you see them after church on Sunday? Talk about the service. Ask questions that could be openly discussed without fear of a wrong answer. When you feel comfortable not having all the answers when it comes to faith, it can open others up as well. Share something you recently learned about God or the Bible. Focus on that one person all year. Even if it is not the time to invite them to church, at least bring church to them through you. If you are their only connection to a church, then you are one very important person.
